Call for Abstracts

We invite authors to submit an abstract for **poster display or for oral presentation.** A selection of the best abstracts will be invited to present their work orally during the conference. The ePoster showcase will be live for 4 months after the conference dates to extend the life and reach of your poster.

Abstract categories

- CLINICAL STUDIES & PATIENT CARE
- TARGETS
- MODELS & THERAPIES
- RISK & RESPONSE

CLINICAL STUDIES & PATIENT CARE

Abstracts may cover clinical studies and any/all aspects of patient care/interactions/research

TARGETS

Abstracts may cover targets, biomarkers and any omics research. Bioinformatic projects may be submitted under this category

MODELS AND TREATMENT

Abstracts may cover research developing or involving in vivo and in vitro models. In vivo models might include genetically engineered mouse models or patient derived xenografts. In vitro models might include cells lines or organoids. Abstracts may also cover drug screening or testing of any suitable therapy using such models

RISK, EARLY DETECTION AND RESPONSE

Abstracts may cover research areas relevant to risk prediction (including risk of developing mesothelioma plus survival and predictive models), early detection methods, or how to measure response to therapy. The latter may, for example, include radiology and AI developments or non-imaging response markers.

We would advise you have a senior colleague review your abstract prior to submission as it is marked at the same standard. Please ensure that your submission is linked to one of the categories listed using the linked proformas.

Who can submit an abstract?

Any PREDICT-Meso Network member can submit an abstract. Anyone with relevant interest may join the PREDICT-Meso Network to submit an abstract. We welcome submissions from all members from students to PIs. Please ensure that your submission is linked to one of the categories listed using the linked proformas.

Word count and format

Please submit your abstract using the outline and links provided in the category overview section below.

The total number of words should not exceed **300** (excluding titles). A further 100 words is allowed for references and title. In addition, you may include up to 2 images or tables to illustrate the work further.

Please note that if you do not complete the mandatory sections your abstract will be rejected. Abstracts which exceed the maximum length will also be rejected.

Please ensure that you have permission to use any images that you display in your abstract submission, otherwise you may be liable for copyright infringement and associated charges. Images can be in any format and up to 10MB in size.

Patient identifiable information must not be included in any abstract.

Tips for submitting your abstract

- Abstracts should be well written i.e., correct sentence structure, grammar, and spelling. Plain English should be used. If you are not confident in your written English, consider having your abstract reviewed by an experienced writer.
- Abstracts should have all mandatory boxes completed.
- Abstracts should be very clearly relevant to the field of mesothelioma.
- Your abstract should address the "so what?"
 question. The PREDICT-Meso Network
 conference will attract delegates from around
 the world. What does what you have to say
 relate to people working in different countries
 and research areas?

If your abstract is selected

All abstracts are scored online. Authors will be notified after **1 FEB 2026** if their abstract has been accepted. You will be able to view your score and read any feedback from the adjudicators by logging into the abstract system using your original login at:

The first author of the top-ranked abstracts will be invited to give a 10-minute talk. Other selected abstracts will be invited to display a poster at the conference.

By submitting an abstract you are giving the PREDICT-Meso to publish the content on its website and in other ways considered appropriate including social media.

The decision of the adjudicators is final, and no correspondence will be entered into.

Note about Attendance

One author for each poster are required to register to attend the meeting and pay the delegate fee.

Please do not submit an abstract if you are unable or unwilling to attend the meeting.

Scoring

Abstracts will be scored by two referees with an overall arbitrator assigned to each of the categories. Incomplete abstracts (i.e., failing to complete mandatory boxes) will lead to the abstract being rejected at the shortlisting phase.

Those marked after shortlisting will be marked according to the following scoring system.

Relevance:

 Is the abstract clearly written to target people working within the field mesothelioma research?

Scientific Rigor:

- Is there a clear question/purpose to the abstract?
- Are the subjects clearly defined, e.g., patient types, and are the methods & presentation thorough and systematic?
- Do the results and/or conclusion accurately reflect the evidence and draw appropriate conclusions?

Clear Learning Points:

- Is there a clear Learning Point for PREDICT-Meso delegates?
- Is the abstract content especially relevant and interesting and may bring new thoughts and ideas to mesothelioma research?


Content:

Step by Step Submission Guidance


1. Go to the Abstract Submission Page and create an account:

- Select 'Abstract Submission
- To create an account, click 'Create Your Account Here.'



2. Input Your Submitter Details

• Enter the submitter details




3. Select Your Category

Select the category you are submitting your abstract to and click 'Add'



4. Submission Details


- Insert your abstract title and author details.
- Please note co-authors are not mandatory fields. Leave these blank if not applicable.



5. Enter your Abstract Text

- Enter your abstract text. There is a maximum limit of 300 words (A further 100 words is allowed for references)
- Enter the content in sections following the headings on each text box
- Please note that text pasted in from other applications (e.g., Word) may lose some formatting.
- Upload any supporting files using the "Insert Image" button (JPEG/PNG files only) or add files of a different format to the "supporting files" option at the base of the page. You must have permission to add an image!

PLEASE NOTE: you should not upload your abstract text here; this is for supporting files only.



6. Preview Your Abstract

- This page will show a preview of your abstract. To make any changes click the 'Back' button
- At this stage your abstract is now saved in the system. Click 'Submit' to complete your submission. You can still log in to the system and make amendments up until 2359hrs, 30 Nov 25
- If you do not click submit at this time your abstract will still be saved as incomplete, and you can log back in to complete your submission.
